#### COACHES CORNER :

The following are some of the points and interpretations discussed:

- When a team is not ready to play at any centre face off.
   Technical foul penalty in home sent off for 30 seconds.
- (2) Whilst the pake check is getting out of hand, the slashing is no longer a problem. The pake check is made to all areas from neck to knee and to the ungloved hand.
- (3) A requirement for good refereeing is to read the rules frequently. A precis of the important points would be most helpful.
- (4) Line up at centre face off prior to commencement. When captains are called to toss the coin with five minutes to go, advise them that on the 2 minute whistle, teams must be on the sidelines ready to come onto the field. Teams are to face one another with their left side towards the goal they are defending. The equipment inspection then takes place.
- (5) Interpretations these must be carried out as decided at meetings. It is apparent that there is too much difference between individuals.
- (6) Possession should be called if a ball rolls across the end restraining line.
- (7) There are no penalty spots under present rules. Where a free throw is given within 20 yards from the attacking goal, the ball must be moved laterally so that it is 20 yards from goal.

- (8) <u>Co-Captains</u> Where there are Co-Captains, the referee should only recognise the one elected as spokesman.
- (9) Time Out The team calling time out can call time in when ready. Otherwise the referee will signal the 30 second mark.
- (10) Goal Circle Whilst the goal keeper is within the circle and protecting his goal a defending player who catches the ball does not carry the protection of the goalkeeper. Therefore, if he is checked by an opponent, who is outside of the circle, there is no penalty. The defending player is allowed four seconds to dispose of the ball or to leave the goal area.
- (11) Whilst time off is called for a ball out of bounds, the end of the period cannot be signalled.
- (12) The penalty for a defender or goalkeeper carrying the ball back into the goal area is loss of possession. The free throw is taken 20 yards laterally from goal.

(2) The Secretary reported on the Junior Carnival. Five Members officiated throughout the afternoon. They were W. Barton, B. Battams, T. Tomlinson, B. Greenhalgh and I. Wittenberg. The Junior Carnival was held at National Park on 15th June.

(3) D. Hobbs reported on the overseas tour. It was moved that his report be received. - Carried. Our thanks were extended to him for the depth of its contents.

(4) D. McIntosh asked whether St. John's Ambulance men could tend all senior lacrosse matches. Enquiries revealed that there are not enough Officers in St. John's for such a task. Where an injury suggested such a course, an ambulance should be called and if necessary the game should be delayed until the injured player could safely be moved from the arena. First aid courses are offered before our Season and, for a cost of \$13.00, it is recommended that all referees undertake such a course in 1977.

Coaches Corner :

(1) It is still apparent that some referees are not carrying out many of the fundamental laws such as :-Inspecting the teams on the field with left shoulders towards the goal they will be defending. Tossing the coin by captains at 2-40.

(2) It has been mentioned that the attitude of some referees to players can be quite arrogant. This can have an upsetting influence on players.

(3) Referees are not immediately moving to the spot where the infringement occurred, particularly on a personal

(4) Sticks with lugs are now classified as legal in all aspects.

(5) Face off at centre - providing centremen are manouvering for position, the laying of the stick over the ball is not to be taken as withholding the ball from play.

(6) Rule XI - Technical Foul: Please note that loss of possession or the gaining of possession by the opposing team is the penalty incurred. A 30 second time penalty is in fact a second sentence for the same offence. The 30 second is only invoked where the opposing team already has possession. The free throw is taken at the centreline, where the free come the defending half.

(7) Whilst there may be Captains and Co-Captains, there is

only one spokesman for a team.

There a player is fouled in his attacking half of the field, the players re-commenced at that point providing that it is 20 yards from goal. If less, than 20 yards, the player is moved directly towards the sideline until he is 20 yards from goal.

(b) Section 4 - Shorts and socks are not mentioned as part of the uniform. The Coash is to check with the Referee In Chief.


