Alteration of Rules

Mr R. F. Whyly (who at the last general meeting
of the Association had given notice of motion)
moved that the following alterations of Rules
as recommended at the Conference held in
Sydney 9th August 1902 be adopted by
the S. A. Lacrosse Association

1st Rule 1 Section 1 That the words "overlap" the other length strings, neither shall it nor any other string be so fastened as to be inserted between the word "to" at the end of line 9 and the word "four" at the commencement of line 10.

Mr Ward seconded Carried.

2nd Rule 11. The words "In matches it must be furnished by the home club" be struck out and the following substituted "It shall be white"

"In matches the home club shall furnish two or more balls, one of which shall not be used until the commencement of the final quarter"

Mr P. M. Newland seconded Carried

3rd Rule 14 Section 1. That the words "and must be clearly defined by white paint or white mark or in some such easily distinguishable manner" be inserted between the words "feet" and "knees" in the fifth line

Mr W. S. Hughes seconded Carried

4th Rule 11 Section 7 That the words "with his cross" between the word "cross" in line 1 and the word "nor" in line 2 be struck out and the following words added to the end of the rule "nor shall he check the cross of an opponent who is not actually in possession or immediately about to gain possession of the ball and the word "another" be substituted for "his" before "player" in line 4"

Mr W. D. Taylor seconded Carried.

5th Rule 11 Section 3 That the words "unless otherwise arranged by the captains" be inserted between the words "each" and "with" in line 3

Mr P. M. Newland seconded Carried

6th Rule 11 Section 11 That the words "be allowed to stand closer than 5 yards from," be inserted between ~~shall~~ the word "shall" at the end of line 1 and the word "interfere" at the beginning of line 2.

Mr Wyly also read the following recommendation resolved at the adjourned meeting "That it was decided to ask the different Lacrosse Associations to curtail the expenses incurred by entertaining visiting Lake St. Lawrence."
